


## A visual map of Remote Viewing history

- showing people, methods, programs, schools & key milestones.

(Note: not every single moment and person involved within remote viewing history is listed in this map. Generally this map lists the key players that were 'officially' involved, those still practicing, and those involved in a public way with Remote Viewing websites and media. One group has requested to be taken off the map - we have replaced these with a '?')



1971 - Ingo Swann & Cleve Backster start PK experiments.


1971 (Dec) - Ingo Swann creates the first Remote Viewing experiment describing the weather in Tucson from New York.

1972 (June) - Ingo Swann meets Hal Puthoff and participates in the SRI magnetometer experiment.

1972 (Oct) - The CIA awards SRI a \$50k contract.

1975 - The CIA terminates its RV contract.

1976 - Dr Edwin May joins the SRI programme.




1977 - The Mobius Group is formed by Stephen Schwartz and a submarine RV experiment is performed.

1977 - The book 'Mind Reach' (Targ & Puthoff) is published.

1978 - US Army's INSCOM develops a parapsychology programme.

1979 (Sept) - The first Army 'Operational' Remote Viewing session is performed.



1982 - The first two CRV students start training (Tom McNear & Rob Cowart).

1982 - Russell Targ leaves SRI. & Mel Riley leaves the military unit.


1983 - Charlene Cavanaugh joins the military RV unit in August; Paul H. Smith joins in September.

1984 - Joe McMoneagle retires from the military Remote Viewing unit

1985 - Hal Puthoff leaves SRI. Ed May becomes SRI program director.

*Note: Clear and separate routes in science and applications Remote Viewing starts in 1985.*

1986 - Caravel Project, an underwater archaeology project conducted by Stephan Schwartz.



1986 - Mel Riley is once more assigned to the Ft. Meade RV unit.

1987 - F. Holmes "Skip" Atwater departs the Ft. Meade RV unit on retirement leave.


1988 - David Morehouse is assigned to the Ft. Meade RV unit. Ed Dames departs the Ft. Meade RV unit.


1990 - Paul Smith, Mel Riley, and David Morehouse leave the Ft. Meade unit. Dale Graff becomes Chief of the Ft. Mead Rv unit and the name changes to Star Gate.

1991 - Ed May moves RV research from SRI to SAIC.

1992 - Lyn Buchanan retires from the Remote Viewing unit.

1993 - 'Mind Trek' By Joe McMoneagle is published.






1997

1997 - RVIS and Paul H Smith teach CRV which is very close to the Ingo format of CRV.

\*In 2002 - Gabrielle was killed in a car accident.

\*Angela T Smith was taught by Both Lyn Buchanan (stages 1-5) and Paul Smith (stages 1-3).

\*PJ was taught by Both Lyn Buchanan and Paul Smith amongst others.

2000 (May) - Remote Viewing Secrets: A Handbook (McMoneagle) is published.

2003



2003 (March) - PJ launches TKR. The largest forum, collected tools and resource online for the education, teaching and support of remote viewers.

TKR supports solo and group viewing in any method but emphasizes double-blind protocol. They have a robust membership and session archive.

The staff since founding has included viewers from the worlds of CRV, ERV, HRVG, SRV, TDS, TRV, web/book/self-trained viewers and protocol-psychics.


2004

2003 (Feb) - The Seventh Sense: The Secrets of Remote Viewing as Told by a "Psychic Spy" for the U.S. Military (Buchanan) is published.

2004 - From approximately 2004 the Aurora Group started to share its mixed method Remote Viewing project results online.

The group was the first public mixed method remote viewing group where differing forms of RV were used together in operations and projects.

2004 (Dec) - Reading the Enemy's Mind: Inside Star Gate: America's Psychic Espionage Program (Smith) is published.



2004 - P>S>I & Coleen Marenich began to organize and train a group of advanced CRV students to become the 'Best' operational Remote Viewers possible.

Graduates of the program became mentors to future trainees and took a role in organizing the group's loosely formed professional association by identifying its goals, mission statement, a code of ethics and member responsibilities. The association is called The Professional Controlled Remote Viewers Association.

many students applied for the program over the years, but only a few who have successfully completed it. The number of graduates to complete the program is eight. (as of May 2010).
